Straupe village



In the Middle Ages, Straupe was a member of the Hanseatic League and a bustling town capable of providing for itself with food, clothes and the works of craftsmen. Due to its participation in the traders' union, Straupe can now be called the smallest Hanseatic town in the world.

The itinerary is designed for travellers who want to see more than just the well-known and most popular tourism of Straupe - the castles of Mazstrupe and Lielstrupe. We invite you to learn more about Straupe and its buildings through photo albums and old stories retold by locals and see for yourself what kind of fortunes of fate the town has experienced over the centuries.

Itinerary: the dog-keeper's house - Straupe watermill - Lielstrupe Castle. Distance: 1,1 km. Time: 1,5 - 2 h.
